Weight gain, aging, or physical changes (such as childbirth or mopuse) can affect confidence and sexual

Hormonal changes, chronic illness, medications, and pain can interfere with sexual desire or performance

Different sexual drives

Mismatched libidos or differing preferences can cause frustration, guilt, or misunderstanding between partners
